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## Tasting Highlights: Rosé from Around the World

*Refreshing rosés to beat the heat, at prices that won't break the bank*

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With summer in full swing, rosé takes on a greater role at the table, providing a refreshing alternative to fuller-bodied whites or reds. Here's a roundup of newly released versions that run from California to Spain to Israel to the Rhône. All are food-friendly, and none cost more than \$17 a bottle—worth buying by the case.

**BODEGAS ARAGONESAS Campo de Borja Rosado Coto de Hayas 2007** *Score: 87 | \$8*

This exuberant rosé delivers strawberry, spice and orange peel flavors, quite rich but still lively. Not refined, but mouthwatering, and shows enough structure for food. Garnacha with Tempranillo. Drink now. 1,000 cases imported. *From Spain. —T.M.*
